Monument to the Revolution

**Activity
Team:**

General objective

To explore the causes, events, and consequences of the Mexican Revolution and reflect on how its legacy is present in modern-day Mexico. Students will research the historical period and produce a short video using visuals and narration to share their understanding.

17 **Timeline – 5 Sessions + Monument Visit**

S1: Introduction to the Mexican Revolution

S2: Analyzing Causes and Consequences

S3: Scriptwriting & Planning

S4: Monument Visit - Monument to the Revolution

S5: Editing & Finalizing the Video

Final Product

A 2–3 minute narrated video combining Revolution research and footage from the Monument to the Revolution. The goal is to communicate why the Revolution mattered and what it changed.

Must-Haves Checklist

At least 3 important Revolution topics clearly explained

All students speak in the video

Minimum 2 APA citations shown or attached

Photos or video clips of the Monument used to support narration

Final video is between 2–3 minutes and well-edited

Tips

Technical

Record audio in a quiet place

Use transitions to connect visuals and narration

Edit in apps like CapCut, Canva, iMovie

Organization

Assign team roles early (editor, narrator, researcher)

Stick to your plan but adapt if needed during the visit

Practice before recording narration

Final Checklist

1. The team used reliable sources, cited them correctly in APA format, and worked in an organized way where all members contributed.
2. The video includes a clear structure: an introduction, development with historical content, and a conclusion.
3. The student submitted a complete self-evaluation and peer-evaluation at the end of the project.
4. The video is between 3 and 5 minutes long, with good editing and clear audio.
5. The video shows the monument, connects it to the historical context, and ends with a personal reflection and proper farewell.
